

The Gotzborg Media Licensing Program was initiated on 02 March 2005 by the authority of then Deputy Vice-Minister of State Liam Sinclair. The goal of the program was two-fold: first, the program would provide the Royal Government with a list of active news publications operating within the Kingdom for use as part of the emergency measures system; second, the program would provide a reward to publications for maintaining good journalistic practices by providing them an official warrant from the Royal Government. The program was quickly expanded to include all forms of print media within the Royal Kingdom - with publications qualifying for the media license including today's most common forms of media, from newspapers to blogs, and even magazines. Those entities granted a license would be permitted to display the above graphic on their publication and be listed on the national database system maintained by the Ministry of Communications & Information. Each license is valid for a period of six months, at which time a reapplication must be filed. The policies that follow were last amended in August 2005.

Policies

1. The registered publication understands that should it not publish for a period of at least sixty days, the issued license may be revoked at the discretion of the Ministry of Communications and Information (herein referred to as 'the Ministry') or the Home Office.

2. The registered publication agrees to publish special notices of the Royal Government as directed. This measure is being implemented to make the emergency notification communication protocols between the Royal Government and the Gotzborg citizenry more effective and efficient.

3. The registered publication understands that if, in a period of thirty days, it does not publish at least 15% Gotzborgrelated content (article-wise), the issued license may be reviewed by the Ministry or Home Office and, at the discretion of the aforementioned powers, revoked.

4. Participation in this program is **voluntary**.
