1.0 Plans

1.1 Building Base Plan

Our first priority would be to get the VIP (Ministers, His Royal Majesty, and other important people) away from the hostiles to a safe house. To do this we need a 3 different set escape routes through each ministerial building and the Royal Palaces. In the basement of these buildings a set team is always on standby (they rotate shifts) to evacuate the VIP. The 3 different routes are to get the VIP out as quickly as possible, so if one is blocked by hostiles, you go to the next.

Once the VIP is safe we will then coordinate with the military Special Forces and police SWAT team to assault the building and remove the hostiles, assuming that they are still inside and it is safe to do so.

1.2 Motorcade Attack

1.2.1 Public Procession

If His Royal Majesty and the royal family are out in the open (e.g. wedding) and in an open carriage/car the case is more of prevention instead reaction. Spot checks will need to be carried out to stop assassins. The public will be held back from the street near the sides with barriers and security personnel will be monitoring this by standing along the barriers (about 1 every 10¬15 metres) on each side. All buildings along the route will be cleared and security personnel are to monitor this by standing on roofs and every floor. Local police and military Special Forces will be involved in security operation.

No public procession will last longer than 7 kilometres. Military forces will be enlisted to help with security along with Royal Security Police Service personnel.

1.2.2 Normal Transport

In normal transport situations (e.g. palace to palace), if the motorcade comes under attack, the priority is to get the VIP away and call for back-up. It will become standard for all normal transport vehicles and limousines to be bulletproof.

1.3 Public Event

Outside Event Security will be carried out in much the same way as a Public Motorcade Procession (see 1.2.1 Public Procession). However, a whole area will be designated and cordoned off (e.g. a park and town square) and you must go through designated entrances/checkpoints to get into the area. All

catering and working personnel (chefs, attendants, musicians etc...) must undergo a background security check.

Indoors event is much like the building base plan (see 1.1) except entry to the room will be allowed by invitation only as usually indoors events are parties etc..., with a designated guest list.

1.4 Normal Day/Night Plan

Day: Usually His Royal Majesty will be in his throne room so it is extremely unlikely of an attack having to get past Royal Guard. If they are he will be taken to his bunker (being built on orders from me) in Lonenberg Palace.

Night: At night 2 soldiers/security personnel will be stationed outside His Royal Majesty and Royal Families rooms. Same procedure applies as Day Plan.

2.0 Security Measures

When in unauthorized buildings or motorcades His Royal Majesty will have at least an 8-man protective detail; the Crown Prince will have an 8-man protective detail; and, the Queen, Princes and Princesses will have each a 4-man detail. All details will work together. When in his Royal Palace, His Royal Majesty will have at least 2 Royal Guards and 2 other security personnel in his throne room with him. Other personnel will be stationed at strategic locations. Any people wishing to see His Royal Majesty, the Royal Family, Royal Chancellor or Ministers of State will be searched. At public events and motorcade procession sniper teams will be placed on roofs of buildings.

3.0 His Royal Majesty/Royal Family Personal Protection Details

3.1 Duties of His Royal Majesty/Crown Prince Personal Detail

3.1.1 Public Appearance on Stage

One man shall be Chief of Detail (COD). Two men shall be designated as the personal bodyguards (PB) for His Royal Majesty along with the COD. They will protect his actual person. The rest of the detail shall hang back and form a distant protective role along the stage and entrances to the stage. One man will be a designated a medic in case (MED), 2 men will be heavy weapons specialists (HW) carrying concealable submachine guns. The last 2 men shall be freelance, (GO - General Operative is the official name) moving to where they are needed, having a broad range of knowledge and skills. They will back up the PBs if needed.

3.1.2 Motorcade

Motorcade HRM and his 3 bodyguards (PB and COD) will travel with him and any passengers in his personal car/limousine. The other men of the detail will travel in the surrounding cars. I recommend that the motorcades should travel in this fashion (in order). Four police motorcycle outriders leading with lights flashing. They will halt any traffic coming out of side streets 1st Protective Detail SUV: His Royal Majesty's car and any other dignitaries' cars. 2nd Protective Detail SUV: 4 police motorcycle outriders following with lights flashing. They will halt any traffic coming out of side streets. COD has overall command of the detail. All men, besides the HWs carry concealable handguns.

3.2 Duties of Other Royal Family Details

Same as His Royal Majesty's Protection Detail except only 1 medic, 1 HW, 1 GO, 1 COD.
